

EGG DECORATING INSTRUCTIONS

Preparation:

- Use cool hard-boiled eggs.
- Cover work area with newspaper or waxed paper.
- Fill cups with 1/2 cup warm water.

To Color Eggs:

- Place 1 tablet in 1/2 cup warm water and add 3 tbsp. vinegar, stir until dissolved.
(For Pink and Purple tablets, use water only!)

Helpful Hints:

- Add 1 tbsp. of water to container. Drop tablet in water for color confirmation.
- Add vinegar to dyes (NOT Pink and Purple - dye will dissolve quicker).
- Add remaining water to container.
- Bend egg dipper and place egg in container until desired shade is obtained.
- For brighter color, leave egg in container longer.
- Use egg dipper to remove colored egg.
- Drain well and set aside to dry.

To Decorate Eggs:

- Select an egg stand to create fantastic fruit.
- Accent dry colored eggs with stickers to build your fruit basket!
- Cut felt sheets to create stems for select designs and attach to egg with glue (not included) to finish your egg creations.

Egg Wrappits™ (Adult Supervision Required)

- For best results, use large eggs.
- Wrap eggs before coloring.
- Slip the Wrappits™ around a large hard-boiled egg that has had time to cool.
- Submerge the egg into hot water using wire egg dipper, metal tongs, or a spoon.
- Remove from hot water when wrap completely forms around egg. Allow egg time to cool before handling.

Allow refrigerated, colored eggs to dry before handling.

Condensation may cause colors to smear.

Caution: Children must be supervised. Since this is a dye process, colors may stain some fabrics.
